## **TAX ROLL**

This Notice is used to notify a property Owner or Landlord that a Water & Sewer balance is past due and will be transferred to the Tax Roll unless the payment is made

Mid-October - These notices are mailed out.

November 1 - If the past due amount is not paid, there is also a 10% penalty that is added and we want to notify you in advance so a payment can be made to avoid these extra fees.

November 15 – If the past due amount remains unpaid, the balance will be levied against the property. There is no exception from the tax levy for rental property, however, the Landlord may pay the arrearage and file a notice of lien to collect the debt from the Tenant.
